The directors present their report and the audited financial statements for the financial year ended 31 December 2024.

#### Principal Activity and Review of the Business

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee. The company does not have a share capital and consequently the liability of members is limited, subject to an undertaking by each member to contribute to the net assets or liabilities of the company on winding up such amounts as may be required not exceeding one Euro (€1). The principal activity of the company is to implement the national childcare programmes at local level as the local agent for the Department of Children, Equality, Disability, Integration & Youth while providing support and guidance to all stakeholders including childcare providers, parents and families. The company has been granted charitable tax status under Sections 207 and 208 of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997 - CHY 15148 and is registered with the Charities Regulatory Authority, Charity No 20051549.

There has been no significant change in these activities during the financial year ended 31 December 2024.

#### **Financial Results**

The deficit for the financial year after providing for depreciation amounted to €(2,363) (2023 - €(1,159)).

At the end of the financial year, the company has assets of €23,303 (2023 - €30,230) and liabilities of €17,342 (2023 - €21,906). The net assets of the company have decreased by  $\in$  (2,363).

#### **Directors and Secretary**

The directors who served throughout the financial year were as follows:

In accordance with the Constitution, the directors retire by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-election.

#### **Future Developments**

The company plans to continue its present activities and current trading levels. Employees are kept as fully informed as practicable about developments within the business.

#### Post Balance Sheet Events

The company is dependent on government funding and the directors have not been made aware of any significant changes to the current funding model and therefore do not believe it will impact the company's ability to continue in operation.

There have been no other significant events affecting the company since the financial year-end.

#### Auditors

The auditors, Paul Foxe & Co. Limited, (Chartered Accountants) have indicated their willingness to continue in office in accordance with the provisions of section 383(2) of the Companies Act 2014.

## **INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT**

#### Report on the audit of the financial statements

#### Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of The Longford County Childcare Committee Company Limited by Guarantee ('the company') for the financial year ended 31 December 2024 which comprise the Income and Expenditure Account, the Balance Sheet, the Reconciliation of Charity Funds and the related notes to the financial statements, including the summary of significant accounting policies set out in note 2. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is Irish Law and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland", issued in the United Kingdom by the Financial Reporting Council, applying Section 1A of that Standard.

In our opinion the financial statements:

- give a true and fair view of the assets, liabilities and financial position of the company as at 31 December 2024 and of its deficit for the financial year then ended;

#### 1. General Information

The Longford County Childcare Committee Company Limited by Guarantee is a company limited by guarantee incorporated and registered in Ireland. The registered number of the company is 354157. The registered office of the company is Richmond Street, Longford. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Directors' Report. The financial statements have been presented in Euro ( $\in$ ) which is also the functional currency of the company.

#### 2. Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

#### Statement of compliance

The financial statements of the company for the financial year ended 31 December 2024 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2014.

Longford County Childcare Committee Company Limited by Guarantee confirms that the company complies with Circular 13/2014 and Circular 44/2006.

#### **Basis of preparation**

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, issued by the Financial Reporting Council.

The company qualifies as a small company as defined by section 280A of the Companies Act 2014 in respect of the financial year, and has applied the rules of the 'Small Companies Regime' in accordance with section 280C of the Companies Act 2014 and Section 1A of FRS 102.

#### Income

Income is measured at the fair value of the consideration received or receivable for services rendered and government grants received.

#### Tangible assets and depreciation

Tangible assets are stated at cost or at valuation, less accumulated depreciation. The charge to depreciation is calculated to write off the original cost or valuation of tangible assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives as follows:

Computer equipment	-	20% Straight line
Fixtures, fittings and equipment	-	12.5% Straight line

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

#### Leasing

Rentals payable under operating leases are dealt with in the Income and Expenditure Account as incurred over the period of the rental agreement.

#### Trade and other debtors

Trade and other debtors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest method less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts except where the effect of discounting would be immaterial. In such cases the receivables are stated at cost less impairment losses for bad and doubtful debts.

#### Trade and other creditors

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

#### **Employee benefits**

The company operates a defined contribution pension scheme. The assets of the scheme are held separately from those of the company in an independently administered fund. The company also operates a defined benefit pension scheme for its employees providing benefits based on final pensionable pay. The assets of this scheme are also held separately from those of the company, being invested with pension fund managers.

#### Taxation

The company has been granted charitable tax status under Sections 207 and 208 of the Taxes Consolidation Act 1997, CHY Number 15148 and is registered with the Charities Regulatory Authority.

#### **Government grants**

Grants are recognised using the accruals model when there is reasonable assurance that the grant will be received and all attaching conditions will be complied with.

Grants towards capital expenditure are credited to deferred income and are released to the income and expenditure account over the expected useful life of the related assets, by equal annual instalments.

Grants towards revenue expenditure are released to the income and expenditure account as the related expenditure is incurred.

#### 3. Departure from Companies Act 2014 Presentation

The directors have elected to present an Income and Expenditure Account instead of a Profit and Loss Account in these financial statements as this company is a not-for-profit entity.

#### 4. Provisions Available for Audits of Small Entities

In common with many other businesses of our size and nature, we use our auditors to assist with the preparation of the financial statements.
